Dr. Anderson is Professor of Surgery and Global Health Medicine at the *University of Washington (UW)*. As surgical director of the UW Breast Health Clinic, Dr. Anderson's cared for patients with breast health issues and diseases from 1994-2020. He served as president of the *American Society of Breast Disease (ASBD)* from 2005–07 and vice chair of the *National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN)* Breast Panel from 2013-20.

Dr. Anderson has worked internationally in global cancer control for over two decades. With joint appointments at the *Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center Division of Public Health Sciences* and the *UW Department of Global Health*, Dr. Anderson chaired the *Breast Health Global Initiative (BHGI)*, which pioneered the development of "resource-stratified" guidelines in low- and middle-income countries. Dr. Anderson served on the Board of Directors of the *Union for International Cancer Control (UICC)* from 2012 - 2018. He received the 2011 Partners in Progress Award from the *American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO)*, the 2013 Inspiration Award from the *National Consortium of Breast Centers (NCBC)*, and the 2019 Pioneers of Global Health Award from the *Washington Global Health Alliance (WGHA)*. In 2020, Dr. Anderson joined the *World Health Organization (WHO)* and now serves as WHO Medical Officer leading the *Global Breast Cancer Initiative (GBCI)* launched in March 2021.
